

Legislative Accomplishments:

2016 General Assembly Session

VIRGINIA forever spent the 2016 General Assembly session advocating for natural resources funding. Our efforts resulted in securing **more than \$200 million** in new funds for water quality, land conservation and state parks investments, including the following:

- \$59 million for the Water Quality Improvement Fund (WQIF) to invest in new pollution-reduction equipment for locally-owned wastewater treatment facilities.
- \$20 million for the Stormwater Local Assistance Fund (SLAF) for critical stormwater infrastructure projects.
- \$61.7 million for agricultural best management practices (BMP) funds to reduce agricultural runoff from animal operations and crop lands. <u>This represents the largest deposit ever into WQIF for agricultural BMPs.</u>
- \$20 million over the biennium for land preservation through the Virginia Land Conservation Fund (VLCF).
- \$41 million for new state parks infrastructure, including early development of Widewater State Park.

These successes were a result of significant lobbying and direct outreach to General Assembly members. Whether it was at our legislative reception, a one-on-one meeting with a select legislator, or a letter that was individually written and hand-delivered to a key legislator, VIRGINIA forever had a consistent and constant presence and message in the General Assembly that helped underscore the importance of funding for natural resources.
