2023 BRIDGE BUILDER

MICHAEL LIPFORD



Michael Lipford marked his retirement from The Nature Conservancy (TNC) in December 2022 after 36 years, of which he served 25 years as the Executive Director of the Virginia Chapter and more recently as the Southern U.S. Regional Director. Lipford began his career in 1986 when he started the Virginia Natural Heritage Program for The Nature Conservancy. After developing a successful statewide program, he helped transfer the program into state government, creating the Virginia Department of Con-

servation & Recreation's Division of Natural Heritage and served as its first director.

Among Lipford's other accomplishments are the acquisition of the 1,095-acre Cumberland Marsh Natural Area Preserve in New Kent County. His leadership in partnership collaborations resulted in the establishment of the Agricultural Reserve Program in Virginia Beach, passage of the Virginia Land Preservation Tax Credit for conservation easements, and creation of the Virginia Land Conservation Foundation, the Commonwealth's primary funding vehicle for land protection. His efforts to purchase the 2,000-acre Piney Grove Preserve in Sussex County prevented the extirpation from Virginia of the threatened red-cockaded woodpecker.

As the Director of Conservation Partnerships at the Capital Region Land Conservancy, Lipford provides high-level assistance to the Executive Director and cultivates partnerships to advance CRLC's mission. His current role allows him to focus on the conservation of local lands in his home region.

He holds a Bachelor of Science in Biology from Virginia Tech and a Masters of Science in Biology from James Madison University, with a focus on river and forest ecology.

A native of southeast Virginia, he has always had a passion for the outdoors, and enjoys gardening, bee keeping, birding, and hunting. He and his wife, Janet, have restored an historic home in Henrico County where they raised their three grown daughters.

As a key partner in the Chesapeake Bay Program restoration partnership, Baxter represented Virginia with expertise, consistency, and insight. He was known for advocating for Virginia's interests while fostering collaboration and accountability within the partnership.

When remembering Baxter, his friends and colleagues cherished his sense of humor, quick wit, and ever-present chuckle. He was a genuine, funny, caring individual, and his presence radiated the innate goodness of a human being.

Baxter's legacy will undoubtedly leave a lasting impact on the lives of Virginians and all who call the Chesapeake Bay basin home. His friends and colleagues expressed their gratitude for having had the privilege of knowing and working with him, and they envisioned him cycling joyfully across the heavens in eternal peace.


